Tips To Make the Most of Your Energy-Efficient Equipment

- Set your water heater thermostat at 120 degrees Fahrenheit or lower.
- Lower the temperature on your gas water heater before going on vacation.
- Insulate hot water pipes as well as the first 5–10 feet of cold water supply to the water heater.
